The Chickasaw Nation employs more than 13,500 people, and operates more than 100 businesses in the areas of manufacturing, energy, health care, media, technology, hospitality, retail, tourism and more. The tribe invests much of its business revenue to fund more than 200 programs and services including education, health care, housing and other services which directly benefit Oklahomans. These programs and services are an investment in the future of the tribe and the success of Chickasaw citizens around the globe.

Out of more than 19,000 nonprofits statewide, the ONE Awards Selection Commission chose twenty-one organizations as the finalists who will be honored. Of those, seven will be recognized as winners in their category of service. One nonprofit will be selected as the overall winner and will receive the 2020 J. Jerry Dickman Award for Excellence, sponsored by the Tulsa Community Foundation.
